Norfolk Man Wins \$22,006 Playing 2by2



matching one white ball number and one red ball number from the Tuesday, October 6 drawing, making Lampman's total winnings \$22,006.

One hundred and ninety-six Nebraska Lottery players have won the 2by2 top prize to date.

While claiming his prize on October 8, Lampman told Nebraska Lottery officials that he learned he had won after checking the winning numbers at the Nebraska Lottery web site, nelottery.com. He plans to purchase a new car using his winnings.

2by2 is run by the Multi-State Lottery Association and was introduced in June 2002. Players in Kansas, Nebraska, and North Dakota have the opportunity to win up to \$22,000 Monday through Sunday by playing 2by2. The odds of winning the \$22,000 2by2 top prize are 1 in 105,625, while the overall odds are 1 in 3.59.

Dennis Lampman of Norfolk recently won a total of \$22,006 playing 2by2 from the Nebraska Lottery.

There were more than 7,000 Nebraska Lottery winners in the Monday, October 5 drawings. Among these winners was Lampman, who purchased his winning 2by2 ticket at Fast Mart, 315 Omaha Avenue in Norfolk. The ticket was good for multiple drawings and contained the winning red ball numbers (1, 17) and white ball numbers (13, 15) from the October 5 drawing for a corresponding prize of \$22,000.

Because Lampman purchased a multi-draw ticket, he also won \$6 by

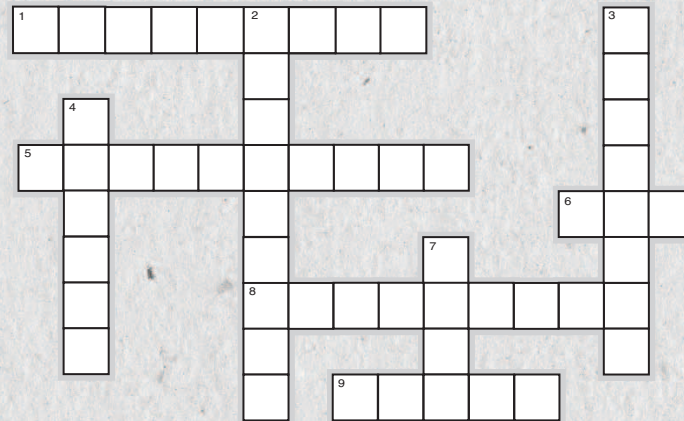

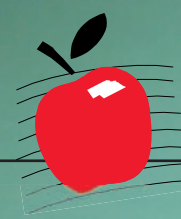

Among the various efforts funded by Nebraska Lottery proceeds is the Nebraska Scholarship Fund, which is administered by the Coordinating Commission for Post-secondary Education under the Nebraska Scholarship Act.

With the help of the Nebraska Lottery, the Nebraska Scholarship Act has been able to award more than 63,000 Nebraska State Grants to college students at dozens of Nebraska institutions.

Grants were made to 14,106 students during the 2008-09 academic year. With grants averaging \$868, a total of \$12,241,846 million was distributed to students attending 43 different institutions of higher education in Nebraska.

Among the students who received 2008-09 grants, 9,392 attended a public institution, 2,534 attended an independent college or university, and 2,180 attended a private for profit institution.

Grants were made to 13,158 students during the 2007-08 academic year. With grants averaging \$944, a total of \$12,421,824 million was distributed to students attending 43 different institutions of higher education in Nebraska.

Grants were made to 11,860 students during the 2006-07 academic year. With grants averaging \$876, a total of \$10,388,223 was distributed to students attending 43 different institutions of higher education in Nebraska.

Grants were made to 13,609 students during the 2005-06 academic year. With grants averaging \$729, a total of \$9,917,594 was distributed to students attending 43 different institutions of higher education in Nebraska.

During the 2004-05 academic year, a total of 12,139 students received grants totaling \$8,336,903. The average grant was \$687.

Schools select students as potential recipients, and the Coordinating Commission for Post-Secondary Education approves the students and distributes funds to the institutions. Grants are made based on financial need, and students are not guaranteed to receive the grant every year they are enrolled.

The Nebraska Scholarship Fund uses a blend of funding from the United States Department of Education's LEAP/SLEAP program (4 percent in 2008-09), the State of Nebraska General Fund (53 percent in 2008-09), and Nebraska Lottery proceeds (43 percent in 2008-09).

Nebraska Lottery proceeds are being used in many ways to help people and projects across our state, supporting efforts focused on areas such as education, the environment, compulsive gamblers assistance, and the Nebraska State Fair. So far, \$357 million has been raised for Nebraska Lottery beneficiary funds.
